

	Learning Objective	Learning Outcome	Activity/Resources/Links
Personal, Social & Emotional Development	I am confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions.	Recognise children’s needs with them to encourage asking for help. Encourage children to explore and talk about what they are need help with. I can link sounds to letters	Reading a book to your child Reading a book with your child – they may be able to sound out or recognise some words Listening to a book read by your child – they will be able to read most of the book to you but may need support with some words. Literacy – Writing	I can hear the initial sound in words. I can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together. I can write short sentences. If you need a little help, ask a grown up if you can copy underneath their writing.
Mathematics	I can say the number that is one less than a given number. I can find one less than from a group of up to five objects, then ten objects.
