Literacy – Writing	I can hear the initial sound in words. I can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together. I can write short sentences. I can use my phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds.	Children to write about what Jack might find at the top of the beanstalk.	Tuesday Live Lesson – 10:30 – Literacy Reading Jack and the Beanstalk up until Jack climbs up the beanstalk. Can children imagine what would be at the top? (It can be anything they imagine being up there!) Red group – At the top of the beanstalk was a..... (<i>giant castle/ world made of sweets/ bouncy castle</i>) Green group – A (<i>swimming pool/ dinosaur land</i>) Yellow group – Copy underneath or write over the top of what they would find at the top of the beanstalk.
Mathematics	I can order two items by weight. I can use everyday language to talk about size, weight to compare quantities and objects and to solve problems.	Children to learn what weight is. Children to measure and order objects by weight. Children to solve problems based on weight.	Weight This week we will be learning about weight. There are three lessons on the oak academy which look at comparing and ordering objects by weight, using language about weight and answering reasoning questions on weight. I make observations of plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.	Children to learn about how to plant a bean and about the lifecycle of a plant.
