





Our School Uniform





Our uniform consists of a white polo shirt, grey trousers or skirt, with a royal blue jumper or cardigan.

In summer, pupils may wear a blue checked dress or grey shorts.



PE Kit (Indoor)

Indoor kit boys - close fitting black/navy shorts and a plain white t-shirt

Indoor kit girls - black/navy leotard or black/navy close fitting shorts and a plain white t-shirt

Pumps or trainers are needed for indoor PE - no bare feet

PE Kit (Outdoor)

Outdoor kit (Boys & girls) - Black/Navy Tracksuit, plain white t-shirt and trainers.

Our School Day

Our school day starts at 8.40am and finishes at 3.00pm

Children need to be lined up at their classroom door for 8.40am. A member of staff will come out and collect the children and take them in to school. Parents are asked to leave their children and not come into school. Any children arriving late will need to be brought to the main entrance.

Every day every class has snack time when you can have water, milk and fruit. Fruit is provided by school and is a different choice every day.

Our dinnertime is 12 - 1.15pm. Dinners are served in the school hall and we have two dinner sittings. You can either have a school dinner or you can bring a packed lunch from home.

2 nd sitting (12.15 - 12.45_	Giraffes Kangaroos
3 rd sitting (12.45 - 1.15)	Tigers Lions





We have a breakfast club which is 8 - 8.50am in the school hall.

We have after school clubs two days a week which are 3.15 - 4.00pm.

What to bring to school

When you start Elephant & Monkey class there are many things you need to remember to bring every day. You will need

- A water bottle with plain water (not fizzy or flavoured)
- A backpack with a change of clothes.
- A sensible coat. (we learn outside in all different weather)
- A pair of wellington boots. (these can be kept in school under your peg)
- Your reading folder.

Preparing your child for school.

- Start by chatting about school.
- Read stories about going to school.
- Get your child involved in choosing their uniform and ask them questions about how they are feeling.
- Practise getting their uniform on and off and choose clothes and shoes with simple fastenings.
- Talk about how fun lunchtime will be eating with their new friends. If your child has a packed lunch let them help pack it with you.
- If they do not already please encourage your child to go to the toilet by themselves.
- Encourage your child to use a full size knife and fork and to carry their plate of food.
- If your child struggles when you try to leave them at school
 this can be tough. The best way is to say goodbye firmly and
 cheerfully and leave your child at school as planned. The
 majority of four and five year olds will settle in minutes.

We are all looking forward to September and hope that you enjoy your learning journey at Purston Infant School.
