<p>This half term we are linking books about animals to our writing. Our fiction book is Dear Zoo and then we are going to look at a poetry book, Rumble in the Jungle.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • write sentences by saying out loud what they are going to write about • composing a sentence orally before writing it • sequencing sentences to form short narratives • re-reading what they have written to check that it makes sense • discuss what they have written with the teacher or other pupils • read aloud their writing clearly enough to be heard by their peers and the teacher. • sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly • begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place • common exception words • joining words and joining clauses using 'and' • words containing the 40+ phonemes already taught 	<p>Tricky Words</p> <p>said have like so do some come little one were there what when out</p>	<p>Measure - Length and Height</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Compare, describe and solve practical problems for: lengths and heights for example, long/short, longer/shorter, tall/short, double/half • Measure and begin to record lengths and heights. <p>Multiplication and Division</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens. • Solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher. <p>Fractions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity. • Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity. 	<p>sleek drifted pretending tempted tranquil delicious</p>
